

After **Supper** Mary Heffernan gave a Reading from The Classics. William Thomas Goodge was born in London in 1862. He arrived in Sydney after working his passage aboard the ship 'The Cathay' as a steward. He worked and roamed around outback NSW for twelve years before settling into life as a journalist. He contributed to the Dubbo Express, Lithgow Mercury and Orange Leader before the famous Bulletin. For the nine years prior to his death he wrote a weekly piece for The Sydney Truth concerning the actions of an imaginery drinking group, The Gimcrack Club. During his lifetime he published only one collection of poems:

<u>Hits! Skits! and Jingles!</u> in 1899. Norman Lindsay considered him one of Australia's best writers of light verse. A prolific and highly respected writer, W.T. Goodge died suddenly in Sydney in 1909 aged forty seven. His poem "The Great Australian Slanguage" gives us an insight to some of our unique slang expressions.

Lorraine Broun - "Hill Street Blues" One of her own poems about a runaway chevy. "olympic Games" was about an aspect of life in the nurses quarters.

Frank Heffernan gave us some Odden Nash guotes before introducing

David Ellis - His own poem "An Aussie Mate". What to do when the TV breaks down. Chess was a game that the two mates had not played before.

Cobber Lethbridge - "Digger's Mule". When one buys a ticket in a raffle for a mule, make sure it is still alive.

Frank Heffernan - "The Good Old Days of Elders". The legends around the wool belt.

Lesley McAlpine - "Get Your Bearings" (Liz Ward). A country girl can get lost in Myers.

Rob Gunn - "A Love Poem" (Herbert Hoover). Before Hoover became President of USA he had some time in Kalgoorlie and fell in love with a bar maid. This was his tribute to her.

Christine Boult - "Mary Called Him Mister" (Henry Lawson). When lovers cannot get past the formalities.

John Hayes - "From The Lanterns" (Richard Maggoffin). If only the hurricane lamps could tell their stories.
